



Barn Rules for Boarders and Students

General Rules

1. Ride at your own risk!
2. Use boots and breeches with a shirt in lessons. No undergarments or bellies should show while riding.
3. No foul language. [For definition of foul word(s), please see management.]
4. No smoking outside of your own vehicle.
5. Clean grooming spaces before leaving **EVERY TIME!** A \$5.00 service fee is billed, if forgotten.

Horse and Rider Safety & Health

1. We recommend individual equine and liability insurance policies. Ask us for recommendations.
2. Equine care changes go through your trainer or Greg. Management will label and make corrections when possible. NO other party has the authority to change your horse's routine.
3. HP grain is NOT to be used as treats for your horse. To avoid founder and colic, a horse's diet should not be changed by more than 1 lb. per day. How much does that bag of carrots weigh?
4. NO horse is to be tied to stall bars. With permission, cross ties or single ties may be installed in a stall.
5. Avoid glass containers in grooming, bathing, or riding areas.
6. We required wearing an ASTM/SEI approved helmet while mounted.
7. NO dogs. We love them, but have no canine liability insurance. Makes us sad!

Tack & Equipment

1. Horse blankets must be clearly marked with horse's name. Dog tags on buckles work well.
2. Stall shares may keep only two items on stall. Night t/o horse hangs on wall to dry.
3. Borrow equipment ONLY upon consent of the owner. Return in the same condition or replace.
4. Ask permission before permanently adding and/or removing hardware to a stall or locker. Georgia law says that such additions become the property of the facility. Screw eyes will remain when you leave.
5. Only marked laundry will be washed. All wraps should roll velcro rolled in to velcro. Boots should be attached to one another.
6. Barn colors are Navy based with Grey trim. Piping is your choice. All halters should be navy or leather. Lead lines should be white, navy, or leather. Trunks may be stored against the arena wall, in front of your stall. It may be Navy, ask your trainer for brand options, or stained wood in acceptable.
